# Norwood Club Leads State In National Rifle Matches

Final standings in the National Rifle Association National Postal matches shows that the Norwood Recreation Junior Rifle Club finished in fifteenth place in their division out of one hundred and thirty-eight teams in the division and first of the ten teams from Massachusetts competing in this particular division.

According to Recreation Department Rifle Supervisor Paul H. Cronan, this is the highest that the Norwood group has finished in the almost twenty years that the team has been in the competition.

In the National Postal matches, four sets of targets are fired during the period November through February, ten shooters in each match with the five highest to count in the team score for a particular match. The targets are scored by a regional referee and scores and the results forwarded to the National Rifle Association in Washington for compilation of standings. Fifteen boys from the Advanced Group of the local club participated during the season, six of them firing all four matches while others fired less. Of the six, only two, Ken Kadaras and Tom Flaherty shot well enough to make the top five in each of the four targets. Of the team score for the four matches of 1949 (our of a possible 2000), Flaherty had a total of 392 and Kadaras 390. Kadaras also had one of the two "possibles" (perfect score of 100) along with Paul Ambers.

The Norwood club finished ahead of Explorer Post No. 55 of Brockton, Marblehead Youth Marksmanship team, Sharon Junior Rifle Club, two teams from Seekonk Police Association, Turners Falls Junior Rifle Club, two teams from the Quinwan "Y" from West Roxbury and the Danvers Fish and Game Club Junior Rifle Club.

Other participants in the matches this season included Chris Connolly, Pete Duoba, Tom Connelly, Bob Fleck, Keith Langer, Ron Gama, John Porter, Paul and Bill Travers, Paul Woodard, and Jim Aaukswich.
