## Warn Truck Men Not To Idle Motors

Norwood bus and truck drivers were warned by the Norwood Station Board today not to waste fuel by letting their motors idle unnecessarily.

Officials indicated some drivers were permitting the motors of buses and trucks to run as much as 15 minutes to a half-hour on stops despite the scarcity of gasoline.

The local board said, "The Norwood Station Board today which will be available must be conserved to the utmost for essential transportation. Every drop that is consumed by excessive idling of motors is just that much wasted at the expense of necessary services."

Officials said that fleet operators should establish immediately idling "standards" for their drivers as a guide for the prevention of gasoline wastage.

## Dimout Rules Oil Ration Renewal Still In Force

A warning that there has been no general relaxation of dimout regulations if Massachusetts was issued last week by State Director J. W. Farley of the State civilian defense committee. In order to clear up confusion among thousands of copies of Governor Saltonstall's executive order regulating the dimout in Massachusetts were distributed last night to war-recovery units.

"The army regulations in no way permit a dangerous increase of lighting in this city," Director Farley declared in a communication to civilian defense authorities. "I call to your attention that any impression that there is a relaxation in the new regulations is utterly wrong."
