# Legion Wallops Braitree, 12-0, In Contest At Civic

Legion baseball returned briefly to Norwood's Civic diamond on Sunday afternoon when the Walpole Legion nine played host to Braitree and rolled up a 12-0 win.

It was the first Legion game at the Civic in two years, the Norwood Post having dropped the sport in 1963.

At Needham last Thursday, Walpole won a thrilling 1-0 game as John Todd fired a one-hitter. But at Walpole last Tuesday it was a different story as Walpole was defeated 12-0 by Braitree. The Ralph White-coached team now stands at four wins and three losses.

Walpole's lead in the sixth inning was a double by MacDonnell. In the bottom of the eighth the ever-present MacDonnell tripled in two more runs to make the final score read Walpole 12, Braitree 0. It was the second win of the year for Mercer His previous time out he fired a no-hitter against Randolph, Heber had two walks and was hit by a pitcher as the Braitree batters wanted no part of him. Left fielder John Chivanni had seven putouts for the winners.

The big story of the game was the fine pitching of John Todd, who hurled an eight-inning game and was in command all the way as he struck out 11 Rocke batters. **2-Day Indian Festival Will Be Held In Hub**

A two-day festival designed to uplift the cultural and educational status of the American Indian will be held at Boston's Memorial Auditorium the weekend of June 24-25. It was announced today.

This first annual American Indian Festival will feature great names in the Indian arts, a parade, band concerts, dances and numerous other entertainment features with representatives from various tribes from throughout the United States and Canada participating.

The two-day festival is under the sponsorship of American Indians, Inc., a non-profit organization whose initial proceeds from the affair will go towards a scholarship fund for Indian students and the establishment of an Indian Cultural Center in the Boston area.

Among the tribes taking part in the two-day affair are the Sioux, Navajo, Iroquois, Mic Mac, Narragansett, Mohawk, Cherokee, Algonquin, Kiowa, Hopi, Yuma and other tribes from all over this nation and Canada.

Those in attendance will thrill to the major and celebrated traditional dances of the Plain, Mountain and Northwestern Woodland Indians. Among the top units is the Navajo Tribal Band whose members are the hand-picked elite of the Navajo Reservation which embraced the states of Colorado, Utah, Arizona and New Mexico — an acreage more than twice the size of Massachusetts. This band has been featured at three Presidential inaugurations.
