# Norwood Track Team Ends Year As Unbeaten Champ

The Norwood High School outdoor track team rules as the undefeated champion of the Bay State League, having defeated Milton 103-28 to wind up the season in fine form.

The Milton meet completed a banner year for the team, which had set a 6.1 cross country record, a 6.1 indoor record, and now a 9.0 outdoor mark for a record of 23.2 overall. This is the best mark for any of the high school teams. It is also the first time in years that a Norwood team has gone undefeated in any sport.

Records galore were set by Bill O'Meara of Milton with a 100 yard race, followed by Chris Efferitz and Joe Maloney of Norwood, who chose to stop jumping after Norwood had already clinched the meet.

In the pole vault, Chris Hoxie of Milton continued his string of wins with a leap of 10'6". Dave Thomas of Norwood finished second with Phil Jacobs taking the third.

Mike Snellgrove led the league in the two-mile, including his record of 10-07.5. Jim switched from his usual mile event to get in practice for the State and Conference meets. Brad Bedard took third for Norwood, also in a good time.
